3. Venue: Class rooms, MCAS


4. No. of Participants: 1672

5. About Event:

- **Total Participation:** A total of **1672 students** from various classes enthusiastically participated in the challenge. This impressive turnout highlights the students' keen interest in the subject and the effectiveness of the volunteers' direct outreach.
- Quiz Format: The quiz consisted of **15 questions** designed to be concise yet highly informative. Questions covered a range of topics, including the different types of narcotics, their health consequences, the legal framework surrounding drug abuse, and the importance of saying no to peer pressure. The brief format ensured that the quiz could be completed within a classroom session without disrupting the regular academic schedule.
- Conducted by Anti-Drug Club and NSS Volunteers: The volunteers from both the Anti-Drug Club
 and NSS took on the responsibility of conducting the program in the classrooms. Their duties
 included introducing the topic, explaining the quiz rules, administering the questions, and
 compiling the scores. Their direct interaction with their peers made the event more relatable and
 impactful, as students were more likely to be open and receptive to the information from their
 fellow students.

6. About Event:

The NSS Unit and Antidrug Club of Muthayammal College of Arts and Science ,Rasipuram jointly organized an Antidrug Awareness and Pamphlet Distribution Campaign to educate the public about the harmful effects of drug abuse and to promote the Drug-Free Tamil Nadu initiative.

As part of the program, NSS volunteers actively participated in distributing awareness pamphlets at the bus stand, auto stand, and nearby shops. The pamphlets contained information on the ill effects of drug use, the Drug-Free Tamil Nadu Mobile App, and the Helpline/Complaint Number (10581) for reporting drug-related activities.

Volunteers interacted with auto drivers, shop owners, and the general public, explaining how to use the Drug-Free Tamil Nadu App to register complaints confidentially:

- 1. Download the *Drug-Free Tamil Nadu* app from the Google Play Store.
- 2. Open the app and select "Report Complaint."
- 3. Enter details of the incident or suspected activity.
- 4. Upload photos or videos (optional).
- 5. Submit the complaint it will be sent directly to the concerned authorities for further action.

The volunteers also encouraged the public to share this information and to support the mission of creating a drug-free community.
